Inspire a global movement through a creative network that drives climate action, protects and preserves our natural ecosystems, fosters social change, and enhances ecological consciousness.

We are facing a planetary crisis, and the urgency to address these environmental challenges cannot be overstated. Immediate and transformative action is required on a global scale to mitigate the damage, restore ecosystems, and ensure a sustainable future for all life on Earth. Scientists, governments, NGOs, and the private sector are all calling for coordinated efforts to combat the crisis, and Artists on Expedition's transdisciplinary, in-the-field approach is leading the way.

Alarming Trends

Extreme climate change and ecological degradation are accelerating, with rising temperatures, intensified weather events, and rapid species extinction threatening ecosystems worldwide. Deforestation, pollution, and habitat loss further disrupt the planet's balance, while ocean acidification, freshwater scarcity, and soil erosion exacerbate the crisis, demanding urgent, transformative global action.

Lack of Appropriate Action

How We Work



1. Connection

We invite a small group of artists from a variety of disciplines to join an artists-on-expedition program with scientists and Indigenous people, forming a transdisciplinary expedition team.



2. Immersion

The unique expedition team and the authentic artists-on-expedition experience through the Epic Ecosystem generates inspiration, imagination, innovation, and Impact Art.



3. Creation

After the conclusion of the program, each artist will return to their studio and create a piece of artwork based on their experience which will be donated to the organization.



4. Dissemination

These works will become part of the Artists on Expedition collection, used for advocacy, to increase our visibility, promote the movement, and to raise funds.


The Transformative Power of Artists on Expedition

Catalyst for Action



Our Business Model




Art Dissemination
